A COMPASSIONATE PHILANTHROPIST

Sri Dharmamurthi Rao Bahadur Calavala Cunnan Chetty Garu

Our beloved Founder, Dharmamurthi Rao Bahadur Calavala Cunnan Chetty Garu was a great philanthropist. He dedicated himself towards the upliftment of society. He was born into the Calavala family in the year 1869. After his higher education from Pachaiyappa's College and the Madras Christian College, he took over M/s King & Company, the family business.

- During his life time, he established two schools at Tiruvallur and Perambur and founded a Sanskrit College at Triplicane to popularize the study of ancient texts, a Primary School for Girls, a Middle School at Chintadripet, and gave financial aid to many schools in and around Chennai.
- He established a library for the benefit of the students of the City of Madras.
- He started Ayurvedic Hospitals in Triplicane, Nungambakkam and Nellore.
- He personally supervised feeding of poor & needy.
- He extended help to the Ramakrishna Mutt at Mylapore by an annual grant.
- He was instrumental in starting evening schools for adults in economically backward areas.
- He made arrangements for the distribution of milk to poor children in his house at Govindappa Naick Street, Chennai.
- A sum of Rupees Seventy Five Thousand was spent annually on charitable endowments as early as the 1920s.
- He donated Rupees One Lakh to Pachaiyappa's Trust in the year 1919.

Sri C.Kandaswami Naidu who has donated his properties to Pachaiyappa's Trust and in whose name two Arts & Science colleges are functioning in Chennai and Cuddalore had to fight against the difficulties and adverse circumstances during his early days but his employment under Sri Calavala Cunnan Chetty helped him to reach a reasonable competency and retain a decent reputation for good workmanship.

- Treasurer of Madras Pinjrapole
- Member of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals

- As one of the Vice-Presidents, he gave large monetary assistance to the Madras Social Service League.
- He showed great interest in the development of industries and deputed students on scholarship to Bombay for industrial training.
- He gave a brilliant lecture as the Chairman of the Reception Committee of the Provincial Conference at Kanchipuram during 1918. He was offered a Membership in the City Corporation Council.

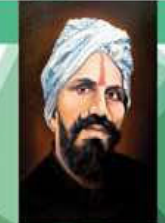

Our Founder was so service minded that his "Will" says "that the bulk of my properties should be utilized for Charities and that my name should be perpetuated not by descendants but by schemes of public benefaction which I am anxious to organize and provide for.....". He made his final will and testament on 19.7.1920, by which he bequeathed his entire properties for the cause of education and other charitable purposes and established a Public Charitable Trust 'Dharmamurthi Rao Bahadur Calavala Cunnan Chetty's Charities' with the willing co-operation and selfless magnanimity of his dutiful wife Smt. Calavala Seethamma Garu.

Mahakavi Bharathiyar about our Founder

The great Tamil Poet **Mahakavi Bharathiyar** in his book titled **Nambikkai** talks about the magnanimity of our Founder. To quote from the book, "Sri Rao Bahadur Calavala Cunnan Chetty Garu stands as a doyen in establishing the 'Dharma' during these days and the spirit of equality in other religions should spread in the educational institutions founded by him". He prayed Goddess 'Parasakthi' to bestow Her Blessings on him to fulfill this desire.

Mr Justice T.V. Sheshagiri Aiyar: Mr Cunnan Chettiar was simple and unostentatious in his charities. By doing charity he believed that he was doing service to God.

Mr Kasthuriranga Aiyangar moved the following resolution – This public meeting of the citizens of Madras desire to record their profound sorrow and grief at the untimely death of Rao Bahadur Calavala Cunnan Chettiar whose patriotic and philanthropic munificence and activities on behalf of his fellow countrymen will ever be gratefully cherished by them.

Mr V.V.Srinivasa Aiyangar: His benefactions were not confined to particular section or class of people but embraced the interest of all classes from the highest to the lowest.

Mrs Annie Besant: Wherever it was needed, help was given by the late Mr. Cunnan Chettiar. His presence at a public function always meant self-sacrificing and generous help. His help was of the kind most welcome to the poorer classes – education in schools or succour in his dispensaries. He was a strong supporter of the indigenous system of medicine.

Mr Govindaraghava Aiyer : Mr. Cunnan Chettiar embodied in himself a number of virtues which might be found separately in very many but the collection of which very few had the privilege to possess.

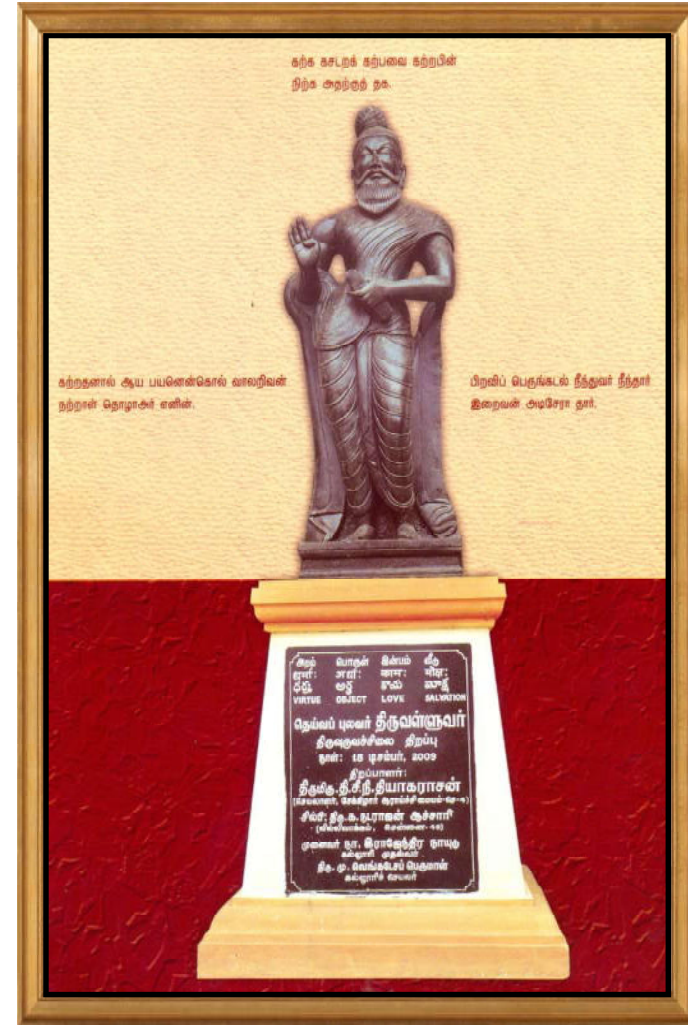
Mr A.Rangaswamy Aiyangar: Madras is bereft of a most charismatic personality who did not want a name but who was always ready to help any public cause.

Mr S.Satyamurti: Mr. Pachaiyappa Mudaliar endowed three and half lakhs, whereas Mr. Cunnan Chettiar endowed over 20 lakhs for charities. His charities knew of no communal leanings. His path of life was not one leading to glory but was one of charity leading to immortality.

Letters of Tribute from Messers **Lodd Govindas** and **B.P.Wadia** were read. (Hindu Archives: 31-08-1920)

Sri Cunnan Chetty was conferred the title 'Dharmamurthi' posthumously. The citation 'Rao Bahadur' was conferred by the British Government for his service to society. The residents of Triplicane honoured him by conferring the Title 'Kodai Vallal'.

IMPORTANT NOTICE **RAGGING - AN OFFENCE**

Ragging in any form, in any place or time is a cognizable offence that will attract severe punishment including summary expulsion from the College / Institution / University.

Extract of Tamil Nadu Govt. Gazette - Extra ordinary dt. 26.7.1999 (Act. No. 7 of 1997 Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act)

1. In this Act, unless the context other wise requires, "Ragging" means display of noise, disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in any educational institution and includes :-
 - (a) Teasing, abusing or playing practical jokes on, causing hurt to such student; or
 - (b) Asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not, in the ordinary course, willingly act or perform.

2. Ragging within or outside any educational institution is prohibited.
3. Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or propagates "Ragging" within or outside any educational Institution, shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees.
4. Any student convicted of an offence under section 4 shall also be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution.
5. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, whenever any student complains of ragging to the head of an educational institution, or to any other person responsible for the management of the educational institution, such head of the educational institution or person responsible for the management of the educational institution shall inquire into the same immediately and if found true shall suspend the student, who has committed the offence, from the educational institution.

Wherever help was needed, help was given by the late Mr. Cunnan Chettiar. His presence at a public function always meant self-sacrificing and generous help. His help was of the kind most welcome to the poorer classes - education in schools or succour in dispensaries. He was a strong supporter of the indigenous system of medicine. To such a man a memorial in the form of a statue might very well be raised not for the sake of the man who had left behind him several charities, but for the sake of the community which has largely benefited. The good deeds of Mr. Cunnan Chettiar would accompany him after death and protect him on his onward path to the other world.

ABOUT OUR FOUNDER

The origin of the college is traced back to the LAST WILL and TESTAMENT of the born-to-serve man, Calavala Cunnan Chetty Garu. He had the divine grace of being a doyen in the Arya Vysya community. The seer was so service minded that his WILL says, "... the bulk of my properties should be utilised for charities and that my name should be perpetuated not by descendants but by schemes of public benefactions which I am anxious to organise and provide for". To fructify his vision, he established a Hindu Public Charitable Trust 'Dharmamurthi Rao Bahadur Calavala Cunnan Chetty's Charities' and nominated prominent citizens from the Arya Vysya community as its members.

The great man was of the view that education alone could uplift the downtrodden. He himself had established a Sanskrit College at Triplicane and an Elementary School at Mambalam (T.Nagar). He financially supported a primary school for girls at Chintadripet, a girls' school at Narayana Mudali Street, George Town and another school at Thambu Chetty Street, near Parry's Corner. He was also maintaining a library for use by the poor students.

Not content with the educational services, he was also running ayurvedic dispensaries and free choultries. He was also a prominent member of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA).

ABOUT OUR CHARITIES

The members of the Trust Board are dedicated and have strongly resolved to continue the Founder's academic services. The result is four famous schools and a college viz. Dharmamurthi Rao Bahadur Calavala Cunnan Chetty's Hindu Higher Secondary School at Tiruvallur (1887), Dharmamurthi Rao Bahadur Calavala Cunnan Chetty's Higher Secondary School at Perambur (1890), Seetha Kingston Matriculation Higher Secondary School at Kilpauk (1969), Calavala Cunnan Chetty's Hindu Matriculation Higher Secondary School at Kakkalur (2003) and - Dharmamurthi Rao Bahadur Calavala Cunnan Chetty's Hindu College at Pattabiram (1969). The College and the Seetha Kingston School were started to commemorate the birth centenary of our testator.

The Trust, in continuation of the Founder's social services, makes regular monthly contributions to many needy institutions and individuals. Abhaya Nilayam at Mylapore and the Society for the Protection of Children - the Destitute Home at Washermenpet are among the numerous institutions that enjoy the financial assistance of our Trust. A modern free choultry is being run at Egmore for those who come to Chennai for medical treatment. The Trust also voluntarily donated a substantial sum towards the cost of five class rooms to Sri Kanyaka Parameswari Devasthanam and Charities for their Women's College at Kothwal Market, Chennai.

Sri Swami Venkatachalam Chetty was the President and Sri Vemuru Parthasarathi Chetty was the first correspondent of all the educational institutions under the charities. The former thought of upgrading the high school into a college. In 1963 the idea of establishing a college was vigorously pursued by Sri. C. Ethiraj, the then Honorary Correspondent of all the educational institutions under the charities. He successfully realised this vision in 1969. Thiru. D. Rajarathnam, the then M.L.A. of Poonamallee Constituency, helped the charities to acquire suitable land for the college. The Government of Tamil Nadu permitted the management to enter upon 21.52 acres of land within the Avadi Township area on the Madras - Tiruvallur State Highway at Pattabiram. Lecture halls were built within a month at a cost of Rs. 1.5 lakhs. A master plan was prepared for permanent buildings at an estimated cost of Rs.25 lakhs.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

The college started functioning from 3rd July, 1969 with PUC classes in humanities. In 1970, B.A. History, B.A. Economics and B.Sc. Mathematics courses were introduced. During 1971 - 1974 strenuous efforts were made to acquire more land and to obtain alienation orders from the government for the entire extent of 39.52 acres. A building grant of Rs. 75,000 was received from the Government of Tamil Nadu due to the initiative of Sri. G. Govindarajan, the then Principal.

The foundation stone for the new block was laid in September 1973. Sri C. Ethiraj had been a great asset as well as source of strength to the college as the first Honorary Correspondent. He rendered proverbial services to this Institution during his tenure. In fact, his untiring efforts and commitment are the real foundations on which the college is built up. He laid down his office as the Honorary Correspondent of the college in March 1975.

The management committee was then re-constituted and re-designated as Educational Sub-Committee. Sri. M. Namalwar Chetty was the Chairman of the Committee. Sri C. Ethiraj, Sri C. Emberumanar Gupta, Dr. T.M. Srinivasan, Sri P. Venkataswamy, Sri. C. Venkatachalam were the members and the Principal became the ex-officio member of the committee. Now, the Educational Sub-committee is named as Board of Governors with the inclusion of the University Representative from Madras University as a member.

Dr. T.M. Srinivasan was elected as the Honorary Correspondent of the College. In the academic year 1975 - 1976 the Sub-Committee secured affiliation to B.Com. course.

At the World Telugu Conference held in Madras, Sri. J. Vengal Rao, the then Chief-Minister of Andhra Pradesh and Sri M.V. Krishna Rao, the then Minister for Education of Andhra Pradesh, expressed their desire to establish an institute of higher education in Madras to encourage the Telugu Minority group to pursue higher education. Sri C. Emberumanar Gupta, one of our trustees, suggested to Sri J.V. Somayajulu that opening a new institution would require land and more funds. Instead the Government of Andhra Pradesh might extend their assistance to

'Dharmamurthi Rao Bahadur Calavala Cunnan Chetty's Charities' which was already running a college efficiently. Sri J. Vengal Rao promised that the Government of Andhra Pradesh would offer matching grants for the construction of buildings. Smt. Narasamma, a local resident, donated 1.17 acres of land to the college.

The construction began in 1975. In March the same year, the Chief Minister and the Education Minister of Andhra Pradesh visited the college. To the delight of all concerned they announced a grant of Rs. 4 lakhs - Rs. 2 lakhs from Tirumala-Thirupathi Devasthanams. Hon'ble Sri J. Vengal Rao laid the foundation stone for the Cunnan Block. The stone laying function was presided over by Sri Justice Ram Prasad Rao. The generous grant of the Government of Andhra Pradesh and the T.T. Devasthanams gave us twelve lecture halls.

The academic year 1976-1977 marks the introduction of co-education in the college. In the year, 1978-1979 the University of Madras granted affiliation to B.A. English. In the following academic year 1979 - 1980 affiliation to B.A. Telugu was obtained. Dr. T.M. Srinivasan laid down his office as Honorary Correspondent on 31st March 1981. **Under his tenure the college had a steady and rapid growth.** Sri C.N. Alwar Chetty became the next Honorary Correspondent of the college on 1st April 1981.

He secured affiliation to B.A. Corporate Secretaryship. After a satisfactory service to the cause of education, he chose to retire in 1990.

Sri M.V. Cunniah Chetty, B.Sc., B.Com., became the Secretary of the college on 6th June 1990. He introduced Evening College in the campus in the academic year 1995 - 1996. The Evening College is under self financing stream and is absolutely service oriented. He was instrumental in introducing B.Sc., Computer Science, B.Com., B.B.A., B.Sc.Mathematics, B.C.A., B.Com. Corporate Secretaryship, B.Sc. Electronics and Communication Science courses besides the construction of Seethamma Block at a cost of Rs. 60 lakhs. The block was opened by Hon'ble Justice K.G. Balakrishnan, Chief Justice, Madras High Court on 25th March 2000, during the Tri-Decennial Celebrations of the college. It houses a computer Lab and Evening college Classes.

Sri M. Venkatesaperumal, B.A., F.C.A., took charge as the Secretary of the college with effect from 01-04-2001. His achievement was to secure affiliation to B.Sc., (Information Systems Management), M.Com and the third section in B.Com. The construction of the compound wall for the entire campus was a marvelous achievement under his stewardship.

The 'Dharmamurthi Calavala Cunnan Chetty Block' was constructed at a cost of Rs. 78.30 Lakhs. It was declared open by Sri. V.R. Bakhavatsalam, the then President of the Board of Trustees, on 8th September 2003. It houses the library, computer lab and evening college class rooms. A 82.5 KVA generator was installed at a cost of Rs.6.50 lakhs. It was switched on by Sri. M.V. Cunniah Chetty, Office Trustee, on the same day.

The cunnan auditorium was constructed at a cost of Rs. 19,32,000/-. It was opened by Sri. Vummidi Sreehari, Trustee, on 10th April, 2005. This spacious auditorium can accommodate up to one thousand students.

The Cunnan Block Reception Hall, additional class rooms and staff rooms were constructed at a cost of Rs. 30,83,000/-. It was declared open by Sri M.V. Cunniah Chetty, Office Trustee, on 10th April 2005.

The Dharmamurthi Cunnan Chetty Decennial Block was constructed at a cost of Rs. 24,11,000/-. It was declared open by Sri C. Venkatachalam, Trustee, on 10th April, 2005. It houses evening college classes. At present all the classes in both day and evening colleges function in well built spacious blocks.

The Evening College successfully completed ten years of academic service in 2005. The decennial function was fittingly celebrated on 15.4.2005. Prof. S.P. Thyagarajan, Vice - Chancellor, University of Madras, presided over the celebrations. Our benevolent management donated rupees one lakh towards Madras University Senate House Restoration fund.

The tenure of Sri. M. Venkatesaperumal, Honorary Secretary, ended on 31st March 2006. Sri. M.V. Cunniah Chetty, B.Sc. B.Com., took over as the Secretary of the college for the second term with effect from 01.04.2006. The NAAC Peer Team visited our college on 7th & 8th April 2006 and accredited our college with B+ Grade (79.05%). The introduction of M.Sc. (IT), B.Sc. Visual Communication, B.Com (Accounting and Finance) and Master of Social Work (M.S.W.) is yet another milestone during his second tenure as the Honorary Secretary of the college. Sri. M. Venkatesaperumal became the Secretary of the college for the second tenure with effect from 01.04.2009 and his secretaryship has been extended for a further term of three years from 1.4.2015.

The Cunnan Ruby Jubilee Block was constructed at a cost of Rs. 3.50 crores. It was declared open by Dr. G. Thiruvagasam, Vice Chancellor, University of Madras on 17th April, 2010 as part of Ruby Jubilee (40th Year) Celebrations of the college. It houses many class rooms, seminar hall, staff rooms, ladies waiting hall, drawing room, multimedia lab, studios, acoustics, editing room, preview theatre and rooms for extension activities. The Ruby Jubilee Block, Calavala Cunnan Block, Cunnan Sports Centre, a big shelter in front of the canteen to facilitate the students to take their food and the provision of a Computer Lab in Cunnan Block to help the poor students to learn basics in computer, English & Foreign languages are the various achievements during his tenure as Secretary. The NAAC Peer Team visited our college for Re-accreditation from 4th to 6th February 2013 and awarded **B Grade with a CGPA of (2.83)** on a four point scale for a period of 5 years from 23.03.2013.

Visitor's Hall enclosing the Cunnan Block was constructed during 2015-2016. A separate Toilet Block for Boys and Girls was also constructed.

The Vicennial function (20 years) of Evening College was celebrated on 19.09.2015 presided over by Justice J. Chelameswar, Judge Supreme Court of India.

The College has started M.A. Economics, M.Phil. in Commerce and Social Work in the academic year 2016-2017.

The College has started M.Phil. in Economics, M.A. Tamil and B.A. Criminology and Police Administration courses in the academic year 2018 - 2019. B.Sc. Physics and B.Sc. Chemistry courses were introduced during the academic year 2019-2020 in commemoration of 150th Birth Anniversary of our Founder and Silver Jubilee celebrations of Shift 2.

The Seetha Cunnan Silver Jubilee Science Block was constructed at a cost of Rs. 3.50 crore. It was inaugurated by Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu, Hon'ble Vice President of India. Hon'ble Vice President unveiled the Statues of our Founder Couple and released Commemorative stamp and Special Cover of Founder. Shri Banwarilal Purohit, Hon'ble Governor of Tamil Nadu released Souvenir and Commemorative Volume on the occasion. Shri D. Jayakumar, Minister for Fisheries, Govt. of Tamil Nadu and Shri M. Sampath, Chief Postmaster General, Tamil Nadu Circle participated in the function. The meeting commenced with Welcome speech by Shri. M. Venkatesaperumal, President of the Charities and Words of Thanks presented by Shri. M.V. Cunniah Chetty, Managing Trustee of the Charities.

Government of Tamil Nadu has conferred on our College "LINGUISTIC (TELUGU) MINORITY STATUS" with effect from 2018-2019.

The College has accommodated about 500 migrant labourers for three days from 21st May 2020 to 25th May 2020 and provided food during COVID 19 (Corona Virus) pandemic period.

Sri M. Venkatesaperumal continues as Secretary of the College for the seventh term with effect from 01.04.2021.

The NAAC Peer Team visited our College on 3rd and 4th August 2021 and awarded B+ Grade with a CGPA of (2.52) on a four point scale for a period of 5 years from 10.08.2021.

The college started B.Com. Bank Management. The University of Madras has granted Ph.D. Research Status to the PG Department of Commerce in the academic year 2022-2023.

Centre for 'Climate Literacy and Campaign' was established on 13th May 2022 and inaugurated by Sri B. Gautham, Trustee.

B.Sc. Computer Science with Data Science and B.Sc. Computer Science with Artificial Intelligence have been introduced in the academic year 2023-2024.

The College has been presented Green Champion Award with a Certificate of appreciation and a cheque for Rs.1,00,000/- under the aegis of The Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board, Thiruvallur by the District Collector on 5th June 2023 (World Environmental Day).

3. All the students are directed to be present in their classes before the commencement of prayer at 9.30 a.m.
4. Coming late to the college is a serious breach of discipline.

PREVENTIVE MEASURES - COVID 19



Students and Staff must wear masks inside and outside class rooms.



Physical distance must be maintained.

Reasonable distance must be maintained from other students while eating and avoid sharing of food. Home food is preferable.

RULES OF DISCIPLINE

1. The students should conduct themselves in such a manner that they do not bring any discredit to the college. They should uphold the good name of the college.
2. They should be courteous and respectful towards all the members of the Staff.
3. They are required to be in the class room before 9.30 a.m. They should observe prayer in the class room. Late comers have to go to library reading room during the first hour.
4. They should seek permission before entering the office or staff room.
5. They should seek the permission of the Principal before joining associations, not connected with the college.
6. They should desist from spoiling the decorum of the campus and should not indulge in damaging the college properties. Failure to comply with this is punishable.
7. No notice of any kind shall be circulated among the students or pasted on the notice board without the approval of the Principal.
8. Misappropriation of articles is punishable. Students finding articles not belonging to them should hand over the same to the Principal / Office Superintendent.
9. Students should keep college premises clean and tidy.

10. While attending college functions and departmental celebrations students shall conduct themselves in such a way as to bring credit to themselves and to the institution.

11. No student should leave the class room without the permission of the teacher.

12. Students will not be permitted to leave or come late to the class under any pretext such as paying fees or library transaction. Time fixed for such purposes during office hours must be adhered to strictly.

13. Students will not be permitted to attend the classes without the prescribed text books.

14. Eve-teasing, Ragging, Alcoholism, taking drugs, playing cards and other such unsocial acts will lead to immediate dismissal from the College.

15. Smoking and Tobacco chewing inside the campus is strictly prohibited and punishable.

16. Late coming and indifference to studies shall be considered violation of order and discipline. Absence from tests, examinations, non-submission of exercise / assignment in time and coming late to the classes without valid reasons, will be viewed very seriously.

17. Loitering, shouting, whistling and other such acts that cause nuisance in the premises of college are strictly prohibited.

18. Entertaining outsiders in and outside the college campus and indulging in anti-social activities are serious offences and are punishable.

19. Organising mass absence from classes / holding agitations and demonstrations and instigating violence inside or outside the campus are considered breach of discipline.

20. All circulars will be put on the notice board. Students should cultivate the habit of looking at the notice board every day. Ignorance of any notice thus displayed will not be accepted as an excuse for failing to comply with directions contained in it.

21. Men students shall have no entry into the ladies common room / lounge.

22. Students are strictly forbidden from collecting money for any purpose without the permission of the Principal.

23. Bicycles and other vehicles must be parked safely and properly in the allotted places.

24. The Professor or the Head of the department concerned shall have power to impose fine and/or to cancel attendance of students for specific period in case of inattentiveness / indifference to studies, and other minor offences. The fine imposed shall not exceed Rs. 10/- for each offence and the cancellation of attendance shall not exceed three days at a time.

25. If a student shows indifference or comes late to the class without any valid reason, the Professor engaging the class has the power to cancel the attendance for the student.

26. Cell Phones should not be used in the college campus. It is strictly prohibited. If the students violate this rule, the cell phones will be seized and will be returned only to their parents.

27. In case of a serious offence, the Principal shall have the power to suspend and with the recommendation of the College Council impose one or more of the punishments mentioned in rule 31 below.

28. In the larger interest of the college and if the circumstances warrant, the Principal in consultation with the College Council may take any disciplinary action including expulsion against any erring student without calling for an explanation from him / her.

29. No student shall in any manner prevent any other student or students from attending his / her / their class(es) or doing his / her / their lawful duty.

30. As the Principal has the overall responsibility for the maintenance of discipline and proper academic atmosphere in the campus, he/she shall be the final authority in disposing of disciplinary matter without prejudice in the larger interest of the college.

31. Violation of any of the above rules shall be punishable with any one or more of the following :
1. Imposition of fine.
 2. Cancellation of attendance.
 3. Suspension from the college for a specific period.
 4. Detention.
 5. Expulsion from the college depending upon the degree and seriousness of the offence.
32. Wearing Student's Identity card is made compulsory to all students during their stay in the College Campus. Failing to adhere to this, will be viewed seriously.

ADMISSION AND WITHDRAWALS

1. If a student wants to discontinue his / her studies for any reason, he / she should,
 - a) Make an application for the same in writing countersigned by the parent / guardian.
 - b) Pay the prescribed fees for the year if he/she has attended classes even for a day during the year.
 - c) Pay all the dues to the College to get the Transfer and Conduct Certificates.
- 2) Transfer and Conduct Certificates will be issued free of cost if a student applies for the first time within one year of leaving the college. But if the application for T.C. is made after lapse of a year he / she has to pay a search fee of Rs. 50/- per year.

- 3) Student applying for duplicate T.C. should produce a certificate from the Tahsildar of Revenue Department about the loss of original Transfer Certificate. A fee of Rs.100/-will be charged for the issue of duplicate T.C. The Principal also has to be convinced of the necessity of issuing it.

FEE DETAILS

1. First year students should pay the fee during admission. Second and Third year students should pay the fee within the first 10 working days after the commencement of the college without fine or within the 20th day with fine at the rate of rupee one per working day.
2. Students who have passed the qualifying examination other than matriculation shall pay a recognition fee of Rs. 100/- and such other fee as may be required by the University of Madras.
3. Students whose names have been struck off the rolls for non-payment of special fee should pay a re-admission fee of Rs.50/- (Rupees fifty only) and other dues already incurred (i.e., fees and default fine to due)
- 4) A Student who wishes to obtain Bonafide / Conduct Certificate should apply to the college office. A fee of Rs. 5/- will be charged for the issue of Bonafide/Conduct, if applied for a second time in a year.
- 5) All payments should be made in the college office during lunch break and after college hours daily.
- 6) Rs. 5/ per student is collected towards handling charges for Bus/Train season.

DRESS CODE

Both Men and Women students are to dress modestly and have well groomed hair. **They are not permitted to wear T.Shirts, Jeans etc.**

Women students are permitted to wear Chudidhars with their Duppattas pinned properly or Sarees only. Tight, transparent and provocative fittings are strictly prohibited.

All students are advised not to wear precious and costly Jewellery. The college authorities will not be responsible for the loss of Jewellery.

RULES OF ATTENDANCE

1. The working day is divided into five periods of 1 hour each with a lunch break of 30 minutes after the third period.
2. Attendance will be taken for every period whether it is lecture or tutorial class of any kind prescribed in the College time table.
3. A student will not be considered as present on any day unless he / she attends all the hours prescribed for the day. In special cases, the Principal may grant exemption from attendance.
4. A student who is absent for one period in the fore noon or one period in the afternoon loses half a day's attendance. If a student is absent for one period in the fore noon and one period in the after noon he / she will lose one day's attendance.
5. Exemption from attending classes will not be granted for flimsy reasons. Parents / Guardians are requested to monitor their wards regarding attendance.

6. No student shall be absent without prior application for leave countersigned by the Parent or Guardian before availing leave. If this is not possible, such leave letter must be submitted immediately on return to the college. The application for leave for afternoon session must always be submitted before availing leave, in person, duly countersigned by the Head of Dept. concerned.

7. If a student goes on leave for more than three days, the Parent / Guardian must write an explanatory letter giving reasons. If leave is sought on grounds of sickness, medical certificate is necessary. This procedure should be adopted for absence of even less than three days if it happens during the College Examinations.

8. If a student absents himself / herself without a leave letter continuously for five days, his / her name will be struck off the rolls and will be re-admitted only after a satisfactory explanation from him / her and on payment of the re-admission fee Rs. 50/- (Rupees fifty only)

9. Only those who have put in a minimum 75% of attendance will be allowed to appear for the University Examinations.

10. Granting condonation of attendance will be considered only if he / she secures a minimum of 25% of marks in all the papers of the Revision Tests of both the semesters.

INFRASTRUCTURE FACILITIES

1. About the College

Our College is situated on the Chennai-Thiruvallur High Road approximately at a distance of about 24Kms from Chennai. It is easily accessible by city buses as well as suburban trains. There is a railway station in front of the college with the name 'Hindu College'. All passenger trains and suburban trains on the Chennai - Thiruvallur - Arakonam - Tiruttani route stop here.

The college contains seven main blocks, Library, Computer Labs, Electronics Lab, Physics Lab, Chemistry Lab, Auditorium, Canteen, Girls waiting hall, Boys waiting hall, Bank, Play fields, Vehicle parking sheds and temple. **First Aid boxes** are provided at appropriate places.

2. Central Library

The library of our college is located in the first floor of the Dharmamurthi Block with a floor area of around 360 sq. meters. It has a reading room, and an Internet Center in addition to library stack room. Our library has a collection of around 56960 vols. including evening college collection of books and caters to the library needs of both day and evening college students and staff. The reading room has a floor area of 90 sq. meters with a seating capacity to accommodate 60-70 students. Many reference materials, dailies and journals (60 Nos.) are provided to benefit the students and staff.

3. Computer Lab

Our college has Computer Lab facility in

In addition to this we have work stations at various points of the college premises, such as the Principal's Room, Office, Staff Rooms, and Library with Centralized Servers and Network printers.

4. Girls' Waiting Lounge

There is a waiting lounge for women students in the campus with all amenities to accommodate the women students during their leisure hours.

5. Boys' Waiting Lounge

There is a Boy's waiting lounge near canteen to facilitate men students to relax/read.

6. Bank

The College has Indian Overseas Bank at the South West corner of the campus. It provides banking service to the students, staff and the local public.

Bank working hours :

- Monday to Friday - 9.30 a.m. to 3.00 p.m.
- Saturday (1st & 3rd week) - 9.30 a.m. to 3.00 p.m.
- Saturday 2nd & 4th week & Sundays - Holiday

7. Canteen

Our College has a canteen located adjacent to the main building. It has a separate Dining - Hall for boys and girls. Snacks, refreshments and meals are provided at nominal rates for the students and staff of our College. As most of the students and staff are coming from far off places by train and bus the canteen caters to their lunch and refreshment needs.

8. Auditorium

College has a spacious Auditorium with sheet roofing and false ceiling with the seating capacity of thousand students. It has a green room and VIP room. This Auditorium is very useful to conduct various meetings and University Examinations. The spacious auditorium is named **Cunnan Auditorium** after our benevolent founder.

9. Sports Facilities

Our College has excellent facilities for sports and games. We have talented and dedicated Physical Directors for both Men and Women students. They give excellent coaching to the students for the State and National level Games.

Our College has an extensive play ground for games like Cricket, Football, Basket ball, Ball Badminton, Shuttle badminton, Kho - Kho, Volley ball etc. We also have excellent ground for track and field events including 400 metres track. There are separate Table Tennis facilities for men and women students. There is a well equipped gym.

Gym

The Department of Physical Education of our college offers Gym facility for the benefit of our students.

Timings : Morning: 6.30 a.m. to 8.30 a.m.
Evening: 3.30 p.m. to 5.30 p.m.

10. Vehicle parking shed

Our College has vehicle parking sheds for two wheelers and cars separately for students and staff. The parking sheds are provided with a watchman to ensure the safety of the vehicles parked. However, College authorities are not responsible for loss of intems or damage to the vehicles.

11. Temple

Our College has a temple with idols of Sri Siddhi Vinayakar, Sri Maha Lakshmi, Sri Saraswathi and Sri Andal. Daily Poojas are performed by purohits.

"Thiruppalli Ezhuchi" Poojas are performed every year during the Tamil Month of Margazhi with special lectures on 'Thiruppavai and Thiruvempavai'. Special poojas are performed on festival days such as Vinayaka Chaturthi, Ayudha Pooja, Deepavali and Pongal.

"Ganapathy Homam" is performed every year before re-opening of the college.

Sri Venkateswara Suprabhatha Seva is being performed from 8.00 a.m. to 9.00 a.m. on Third Saturday of every month.

12. Aavin Parlour

Our college in arrangement with Aavin has started a 'Parlour' to provide quality milk and milk products including ice cream for the benefit of students.

13. First Aid Boxes

First Aid Boxes with basic medicines are kept in various places in the campus to meet the students' requirement.

14. Photo copying Machines

Photo copying machines are placed in the Library and the Aavin Parlour for the use of student community.

MEDICAL FACILITY

Students are made to undergo medical checkup to help them stay physically fit. In house medical facility is available in the College campus for the First Aid needs of students. Emergency cases are referred to nearby hospitals by arranging transport and reported to their parents immediately.

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

Our College has N.C.C. company of 160 cadets comprising both Boys and Girls. A cadet has to serve a minimum of two years in N.C.C. He / She also has to attend Camps / Cycle expeditions and other courses organized by the N.C.C. Unit. They will have to appear for 'B' Certificate examinations at the end of the second year and 'C' certificate examination at the end of the third year.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

Students enrolled in NSS shall serve for a minimum of two years. They must put in 120 hours of attendance at regular programmes in a year and they should participate atleast in one special camp of 7 days duration. Based on their active participation, they will be deputed for inter collegiate and inter - University camps.

Physical Education

A student who chooses Physical Education should undergo a course of Physical Training as prescribed by the Physical Director. He / She is required to put in a minimum of 40 days of attendance in a year. Outstanding sports persons are given admission under separate quota for sports. They are further encouraged by giving provided free refreshments during practice sessions, Sports suits and Jersey etc.

Citizen Consumer Club

Citizen consumer club is functioning under the NSS. It creates awareness among the students about the consumer rights and responsibilities.

Red Ribbon Club (RRC)

IPR Cell functions with the aim of creating awareness regarding the protection of intellectual property and related legal rights.

Seethamma Fine Arts Club

Fine Arts Club encourages and provides opportunities to students who are interested in dance, music, drama and singing. They perform programmes in various college functions.

Nature Club (ECO CLUB)

Nature club is functioning in the College with the objectives of Planting of Trees, Maintenance of greenery, gardening, growing vegetables etc., in the campus and in the adopted Government Higher Secondary School, Pattabiram and to conduct awareness programmes, seminars and exhibitions.

Participation in inter-collegiate competitions need ones honing of skills. The aim of HIKE is to train our students to participate in inter-collegiate and other competitions and conduct skill enhancement activities. Yoga and Meditation Cell

Yoga and meditation cell was established in the College from the academic year 2021-2022.

Since then, the college has Collaboration with Hearfullness Education Trust and organised many programmes every year like the 30 hour Certificate programme, Student Induction programmes and the highly successful Personality development programme for all the students and faculty members.

MANAGEMENT WELFARE SCHEMES

In addition to all these facilities our management has introduced a number of welfare schemes to benefit the under privileged and needy students in their pursuit of higher education.

6. Incentive in the form of prizes to students who earn 100% attendance in their classes, 100% marks in the university examination, and cash award for outstanding performance in inter collegiate competition. Highest marks in main subject and Language in the Revision test. University rank holders are given special cash prizes ranging from Rs. 250 to Rs. 5000 depending upon the rank.
7. First Aid boxes are provided in all the blocks and also in N.C.C., N.S.S. Physical Education departments meet the medical emergencies of students.
8. All students must undergo medical checkup whenever conducted by the college. Medical facility is available in the College. Emergency cases are referred to nearby hospitals and reported to their parents immediately.
9. Generator is provided to maintain uninterrupted power supply.

10. Hot water, Cooler, Public Telephone and photo copy facilities are made available for the benefit of students.

11. Vending Machine with destroyer is installed in the Ladies Waiting Hall to benefit the girl students.

Insurance Scheme

Under Students' Safety Insurance Scheme, a premium amount of Rs.15/- will be collected from each student and the following are the benefits under the scheme:-

1. Hospitalization charges (arising out of accident) upto Rs.1,00,000/- to the students.

A box in black colour has been fixed in front of the Principal's room to enable the students to drop their representation / complaints in the box. The committee after considering the enormity of the problem will recommend for issuing T.C. to the offender besides a complaint be lodged to take suitable action as per the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act of 1997.

COMPUTER LAB

Computer Lab is functioning in Cunnan Block for the benefit of students.

LIBRARY RULES

1. The Library functions on all working days between 9 a.m. and 5.45 p.m. But the transaction will be closed half an hour before the closing hour. During terminal holidays the library will remain open between 10.00 a.m. & 1.00 p.m.
2. All students of the college are entitled to borrow books from the college library.
3. All the users are requested to scan their ID Card before self attendance scanner in the library.
4. An Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) is available in the library reading room to know the availability of books. The options available in this software ease the search for books and ensure speedy and smooth transactions in the library.
5. At the beginning of the academic year each P.G. student will be given 3 library books, each U.G. student will be given 2 library books and potential rank holders are given 3 library books.
6. Every student is entitled to keep a book for fourteen days from the date of issue.
7. Every book borrowed from the library shall be returned on the date marked on the date slip. It will be re-issued only once to the same person for a further period of fourteen days, if it has not been requested for borrowing by others in the meantime. The book should be shown to the librarian at the time of renewal.

8. The librarian may recall any book at any time even before the expiry of the normal period of loan.

9. If a student fails to return the book on the due date, an over-due charge of Rs. 1/- per day will be levied.

10. Absence from college will not be normally considered as an excuse for delay for the return of books

11. All payments including fine shall be made to the college office and the receipts must be produced to the librarian.

12. A student failing to return the book or pay the fine imposed or any other charge to the library will not be permitted to borrow books till the book already due from him / her is returned and the fine paid. Cases of such failure shall be reported to the Principal for disciplinary action.

13. Students shall use all library books with care. Any marking, underlining or annotating in any book is forbidden. Disciplinary action will be taken against the students who damage / deface books or journals in any manner.

14. All library books should be returned to the library at the end of the academic year to obtain Hall Ticket.

15. If the book is lost or damaged three time the cost of the book shall be reimbursed.

16. Strict silence should be maintained inside the library.

READING ROOM

Develop the Habit of Reading

“Books are the repositories of knowledge”. Books are the life-blood of many great thinkers and leaders. Books of all time appeal to our soul and leave an everlasting impression. Reading guides us when we are in trouble and cheers us when we are sad. Reading refines and broadens our outlook. Make it a habit today and utilize library judiciously and to the optimum.

1. Reading room is open during the working hours of the library. All students who visit the reading room are required to scan their ID card at the gate Register kept near the entrance.

2. Daily newspapers / periodicals, journals, magazines and reference books will be issued to the students on request and on production of identity card.

3. Students should use the periodicals carefully. Any damage done to them must be made good.

4. The periodicals and reference books should be returned to the Reading Room in-charge before leaving the reading room.

5. Periodicals and reference books should in no case be removed from the reading room. Cases of such misbehaviour will be considered as a breach of discipline and will be dealt accordingly.

6. Students using the library and reading room are prohibited from engaging in any type of conversation, discussion, consultation, sitting in an abnormal manner etc. and thereby distract / disturb the attention of the readers. Failure to maintain silence is a serious breach of discipline and will be dealt accordingly.

MANAGEMENT BOOK BANK

There is a book bank with 2200 vols. of text books and reference books that cater to the needs of the economically weaker students. Books are lent to deserving students for that particular semester.

All books that are lent should be returned on or before the last working day. The librarian is vested with the power of recalling any book even before the expiry of normal period of loan.

IDENTITY CARD

Identity Card duly signed by the Principal will be issued to all the students. They should carry the identity card daily. If it is lost it shall be re-issued only on payment of Rs. 50/- (Rupees fifty Only) along with a stamp size photograph of the student. The identity card is valid only for three years or till the completion of the course, whichever is earlier.

TRAIN / BUS STUDENT TRAVEL CONCESSION

1. Students under 25 years of age are eligible for bus / railway travel concession.
2. Students should apply for Train season ticket/ concession atleast five days in advance. In the case of Girls, they should apply every month and men students should apply once in three months.
3. All the columns in the applications should be filled in properly. Incomplete application forms will not be considered.
4. When certificates are issued, the students should make a note of the number and date of the certificate and should furnish those particulars in their subsequent application.
5. Generally the certificates will be issued during lunch break and after 3 p.m. on working days.
6. Students travelling without tickets or misusing the season tickets or giving room for complaint by the bus / railway authorities and thus bringing discredit to the college will be severely dealt with. The punishment may even be expulsion from the college.
7. Students are strongly advised to carry the identity card issued to them while travelling, to establish their bonafide as students.

GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIPS

The Central and the State Governments offer various kinds of financial assistance to deserving students. It is based on their merit and social backwardness. Students are eligible for any one of these following scholarships :-

A. Government of India Scholarship

1. Post Matric Scholarship for SC and ST students

- a) Parental annual income not exceeding Rs. 2,00,000/- is eligible for Govt. of India Scholarship.
- b) Parental annual income exceeding Rs.2,00,000 is eligible for reimbursement of special fee and examination fee only under Free Education Scholarship of Govt. of India.
- c) SC and ST students converted to Christianity are eligible either for 1 (a) or 1 (b)

2. Post Matric Scholarship to Minority Students.

- a) Students should have obtained not less than 50% marks in the previous final exam.
- b) Annual Income ceiling is Rs. 2,00,000/-
- c) Two Students in a family are given the above scholarship.

3. Scholarship Scheme for B.C.& M.B.C / DNC Students. Students should submit Income certificate from the concern authority.

4. Central Sector Scheme of Scholarship for college students:

- a. The student should have scored a minimum 80% of marks in class XII of 10 + 2 pattern or equivalent.
- b. The student should belong to non-creamy layer.
- c. The student should not have availed any other scholarship scheme.
- d. The scholarship will be given @ Rs. 1000/- p.m. at graduation level for first three years.
- e. The students shall themselves apply through online.

5. Tamilnadu Agricultural Labourers - Farmers (Social Security & Welfare) Scheme.

- a) Children of the registered member of the above scheme (Identity card must be enclosed)
- b) Non - receipt of financial assistance or scholarship from any other schemes of the government.

ENDOWMENT COLLEGE DAY

1. Endowments of Rs.5,000/- instituted by Dr.(Smt.) Usha Mahadevan, Reader, Department of English of our College, in the name of the Founder of our College to award special prize annually for a boy and a girl with three year NSS service record and also one who scores the highest percentage of marks in the degree examinations will receive the prizes.
2. Endowment of Rs.3000/- instituted by Lions Club of Fort St. George to award prizes from the interest amount accrues on the endowment to a male student champion and female student champion in the college annual sports events.
3. Founded by the Vysya Educational Trust, Madras, with a capital Rs.1,000/- for the award of prizes to the winning students in Oratorical Contests in English / Tamil / Telugu on small scale industries, the prizes are to be awarded annually from the interest derived.
4. Endowment of Rs.1,000/- instituted by Seth Sagarmal Chunilal Charity Trust, Tiruvellore, to award a prize to the first year B.A. History (Main) student who secures highest marks in the annual examination every year.

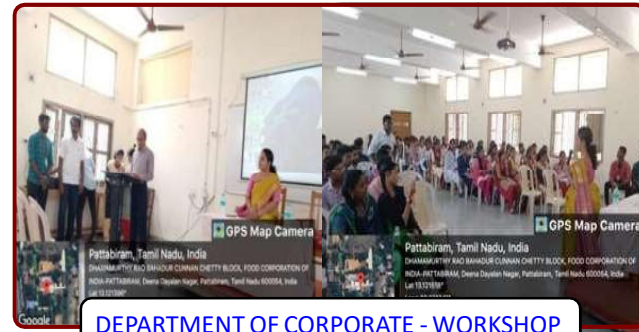
